

This year the only way to drive to Bull of the Woods, Pansy Lake, Dickey Creek and Elk Lake Creek (east) trail heads will require driving over Rhododendron Ridge. An extra hour or so of driving, once the snow allows which will likely be towards the end of the month or early July. Adversity usually has it's benefit, discovery of new places to go, or different ways to get there. Bagby and Whetstone will be our only in-District wilderness entrances this year. You can go through Detrtoit or out of Opal Creek for entrances out of the Willamette National Forest. The two hours spent driving can be five extra trail miles with a Bagby entrance.
