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From Winslow Pit the 4611 gets real rough with deep mud holes and a grade slip. The trail down to the river is quite steep. There is a small camp at the river at the edge of the flood plain. Hasn't been used for several years.

Now would be a real tough time to cross the river. But, there is a very old camp area half way up the east side with a flat near a spring. Look for the old kerosene can. Extremely remote. Very few visitors on the stretch of the trail from the river up to the junction with Dry Ridge Trail.
