TRAIL LOG CORRAL SPRINGS TR. No. 507

Corral Springs Trail begins from Lookout Springs campground and continues down to Roaring River. There is a sign which identifies the trail clearly. It is located near the top of the campgrounds about 300' in from Road S-469. There are restrooms, 35' away from the sign at 273°. A two car parking area is located 65' up from the trail at 80°.

- 2587 Grassy, meadow area. (opening)
- 3015 Trail begins decent at -11 %. Decent continues for quite awhile,
- 3875 Cattle guard #2 with fence heading out in both directions.
- 4523 Continue downhill. Area is rather pretty with large mossy trees and heavy vegetation.
- 5160 Heading 56', with a slope of -14 %. Trail in excellent cond.
- Top of ridge at 340°, 150' away. Nice wooded area.
- Very small dry drainage crosses trail.
- 5904 Drainage ditch, trail fine, cont. downhill.
- 6212 Drainage ditch
- 6248 Drainage ditch
- 7242 Heavy ground vegetation, 1g. fir trees, very pretty area.
- Near top of ridge, still dropping with a -11 % slope and heading 110° .
- 8354 Drainage ditch, nice view!
- 8540 Excellent view of Roaring R. canyon! Trees sparce, beargrass, and rodies in area.
- 8764 View! Trail in good condition, heading downhill.
- 9055 Trail begins a steeper decent with a 19 % slope. Trail has small gravel-like rocks on it.
- 9163 Switchback #1, heading 115°. Beautiful view. trail in good cond. with a 25 % slope.
- 9199 Rockslide and beautiful view.
- Switchback #2, running water at 336° and 100° away but there is no access. Heading 132° .
- 10592 Switchback #3. Heading downhill with a -22 % slope
- 10735 Switchback #4. Heading 150° .
- 11111 Rockslide at 200^{c} . Trail becomes more vegetated and harder to follow.
- 11972 Decent becomes less severe at 10 %. Large mossy rock at rt.
- 12125 S curve, 1g. rock at left and 40' ahead. and the court.

12420	Switchback #5. Heading 26°.
12465	Switchback #6. Heading 164°.
12545	Switchback #7. Heading 49° with a - 28 % slope. Trail is overgrown in spots.
12620	Curve.
12826	Cross sm. creek. Running water which is drinkable. Log crosse trail right before creek.
12895	Small rock slide.
13078	Small drainage, not running of drinkable. Trail soggy.
13736	Curve, heading 163°.
14225	Curvy , steep trail ahead and back. Trail is very overgrown.
14827	Minus 29 % slope and heading 107° . Heavy vegetation and rocky trail. First view of Roaring R.
14961	Minus 49 % slope, extremely steep and rocky
15156	Very nice camping area with fire pit, homemade table, room for a tent and water. Very beautiful area and river.

Summary:

The corral Springs Tr. # 507 is a fairly steep trail. It is consistantly downhill with very little relief. The trail is in fairly good condition until the last mile. There is water available at the end of the trail (Roaring R.) and $\frac{1}{2}$ mile up from Roaring R. At Roaring R. there is a very nice camping area and some good fishing spots. The trail goes through some nice country and it has a view after the first two miles. The trail is nearly three miles long.
